Dear Secretary Mabus,



We also want to salute the spontaneous efforts of local residents who quickly pulled the two naval aviators to safety and then assisted fire crews as they deployed firefighting equipment. This finely tuned coordination between civilian and military first responders and relief workers is truly commendable.




We look forward to continuing and strengthening this long and mutually beneficial partnership between the Commonwealth, the City of Virginia Beach and the naval aviation community.


